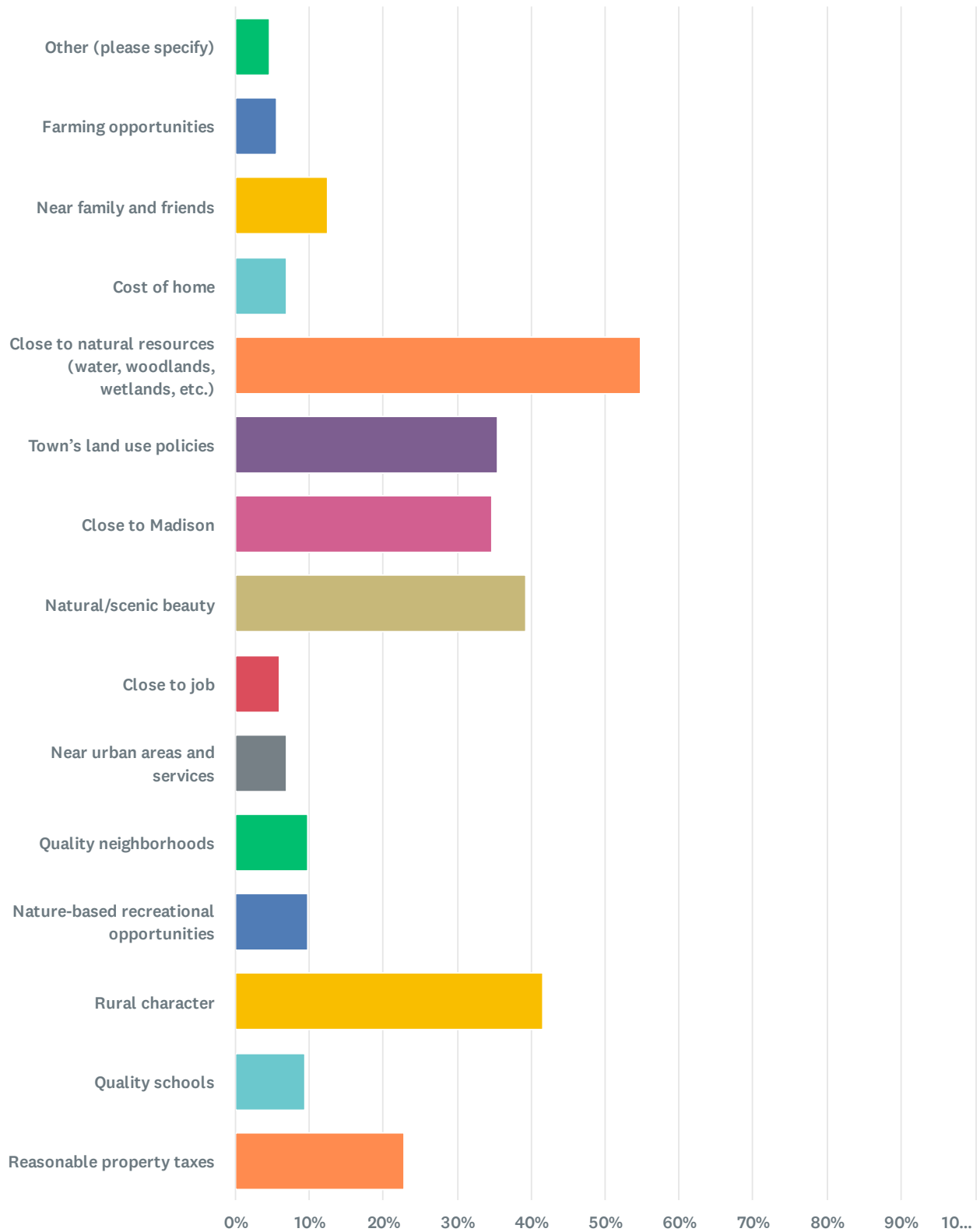

















**Q1 What are the most important reasons for you and your family to live (or own land) in the Town? Select the top THREE (3) most important factors.**

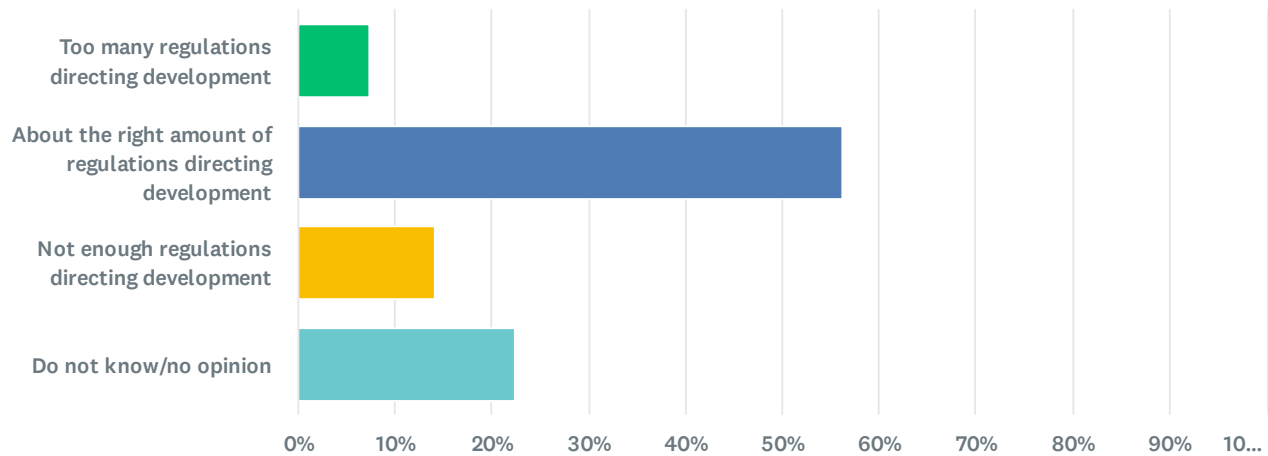

### Q5 How would you describe current efforts by the Town to regulate and guide development – how much development occurs, where it is built, and the types (residential, commercial, industrial) of development?

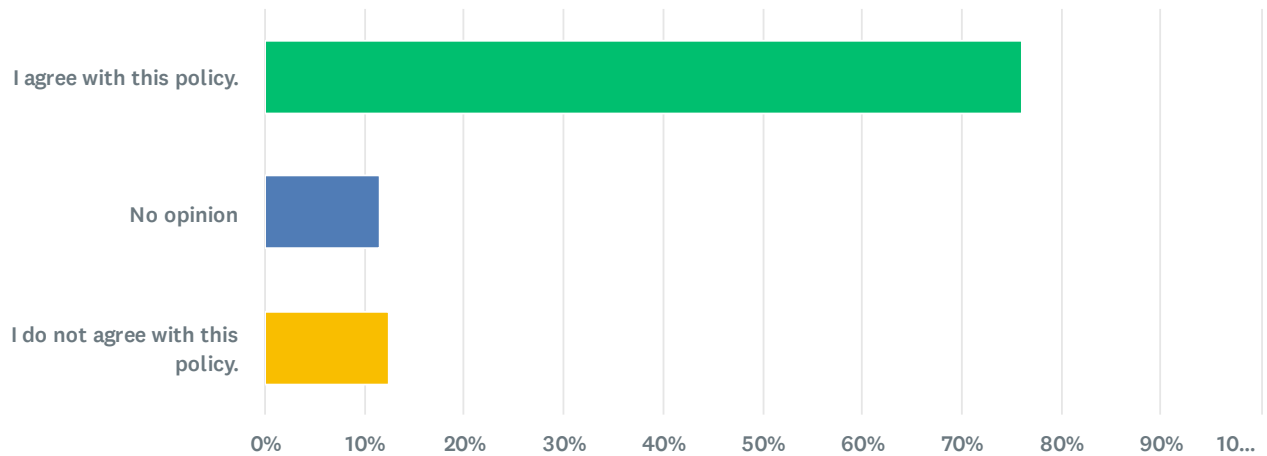

### Q6 Currently the Town generally does not allow rezoning to business, commercial, or industrial, or multifamily zoning categories. How do you feel about this policy?

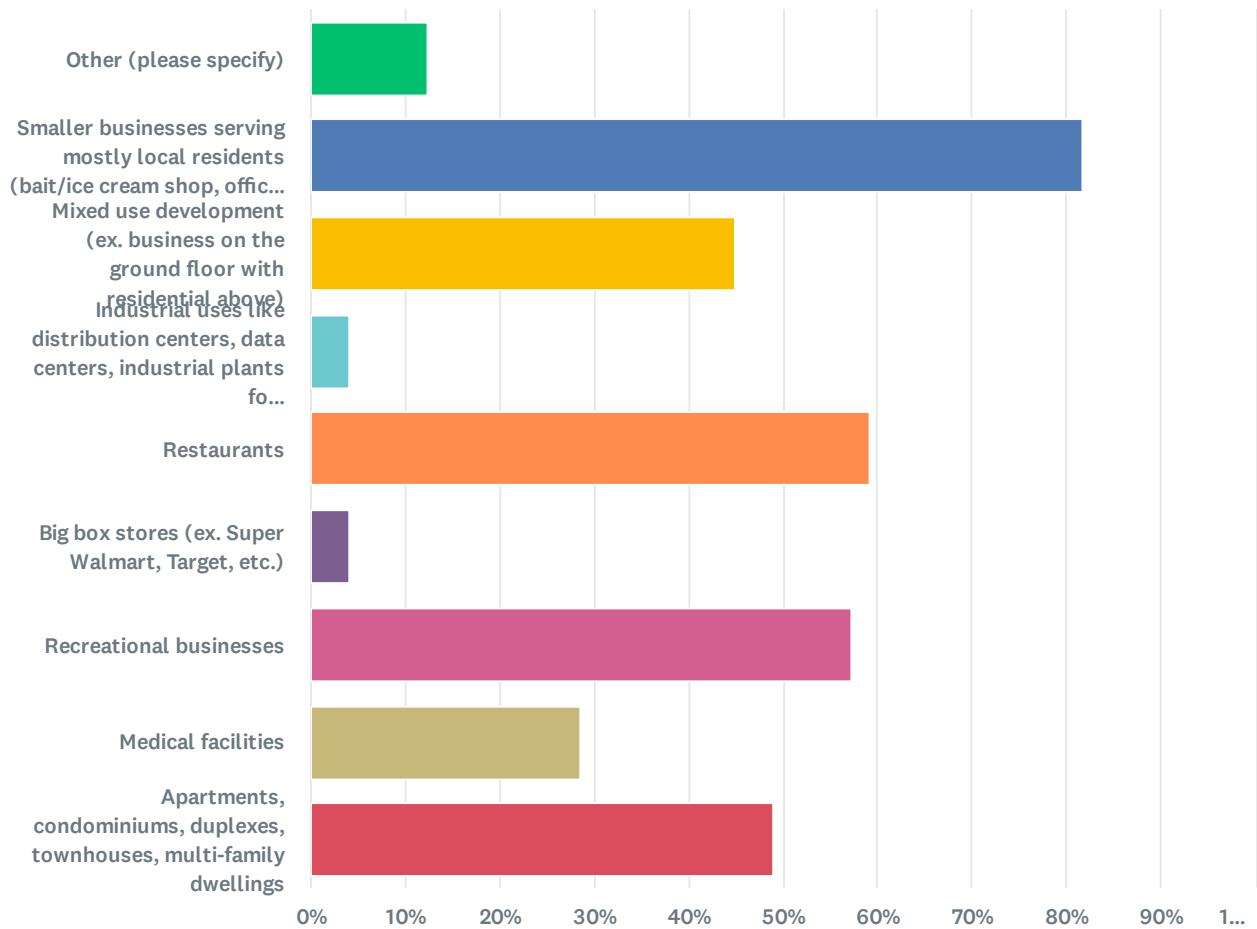

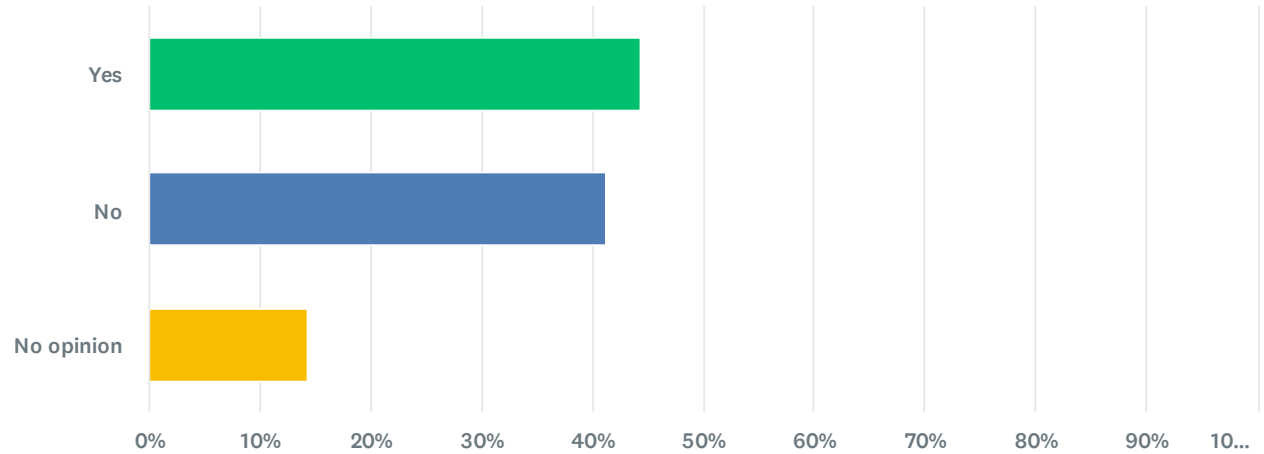

# Q10 Are conflicts between cars and bikes or pedestrians a problem in the Town?

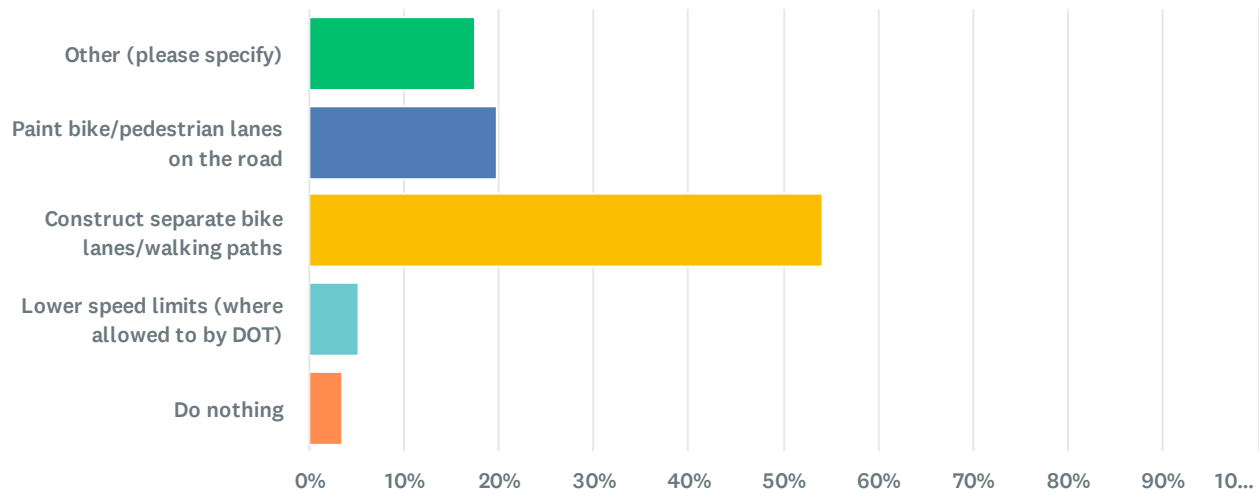

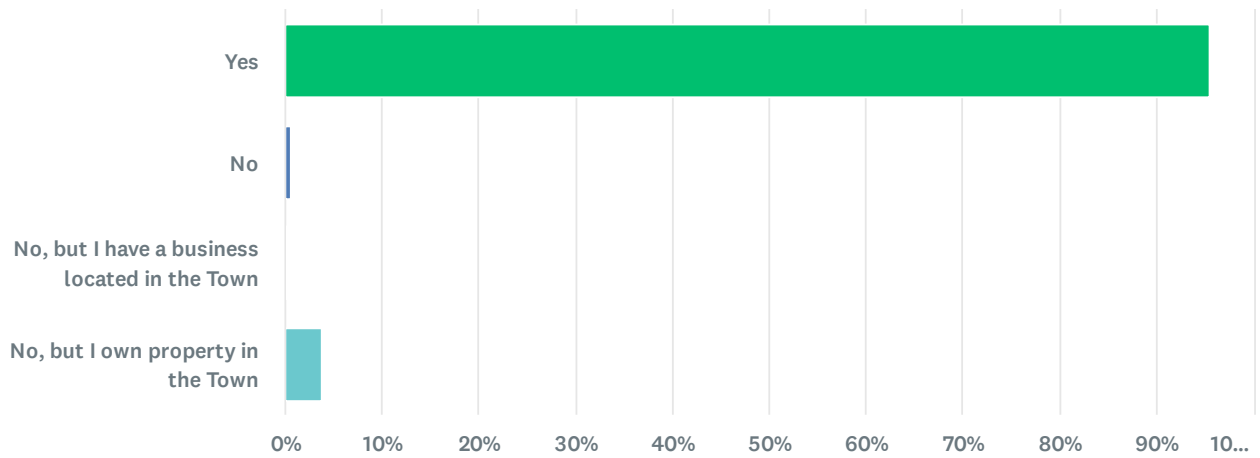

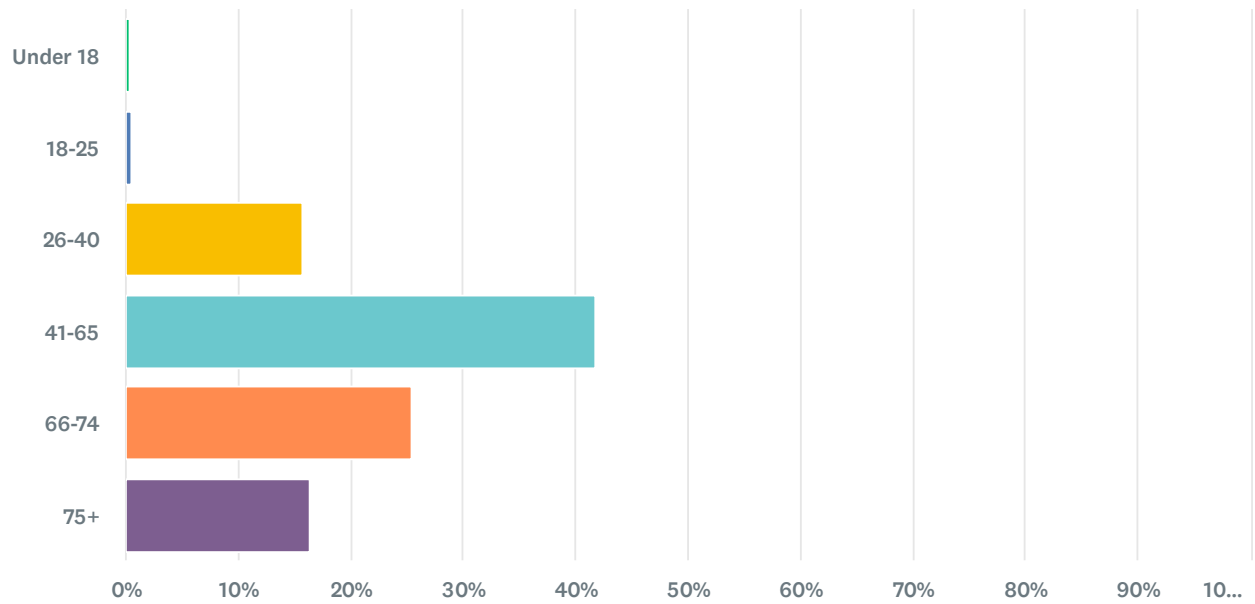

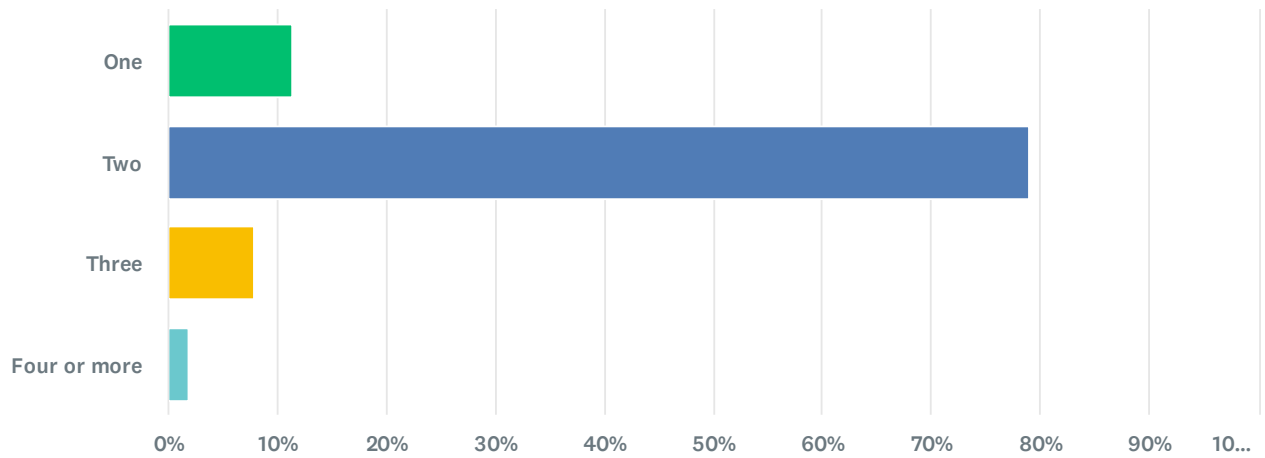

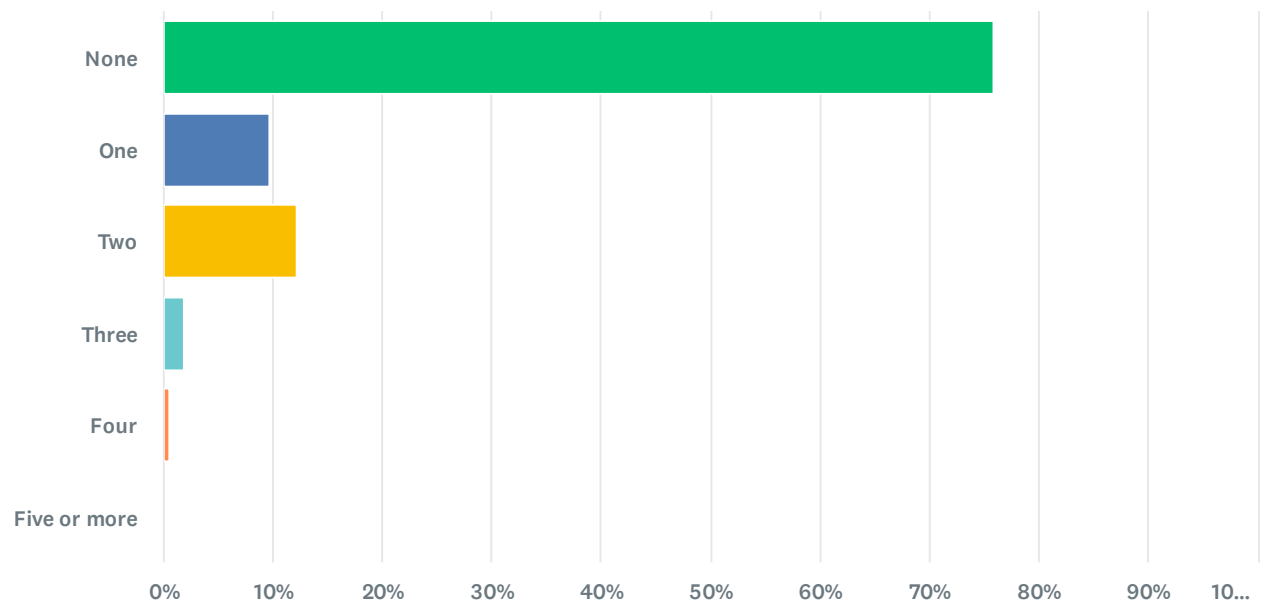

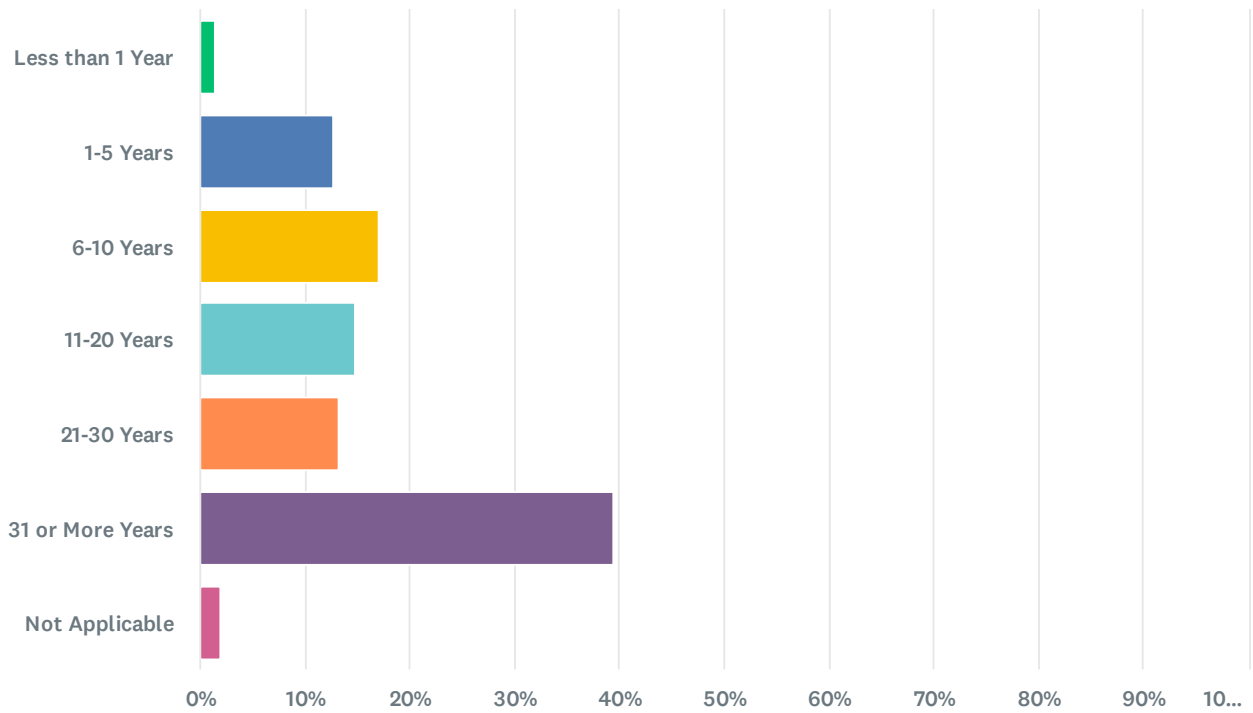

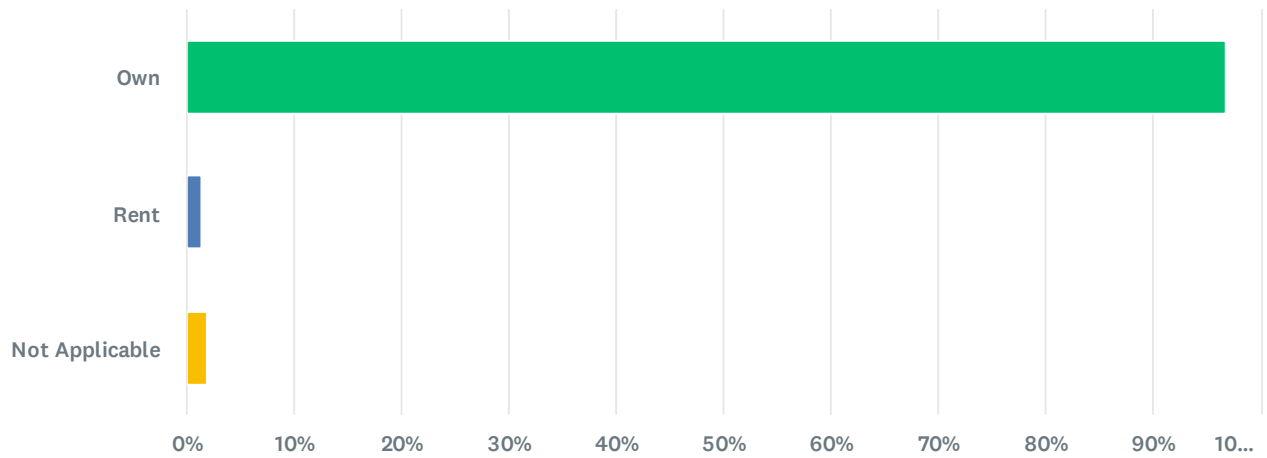

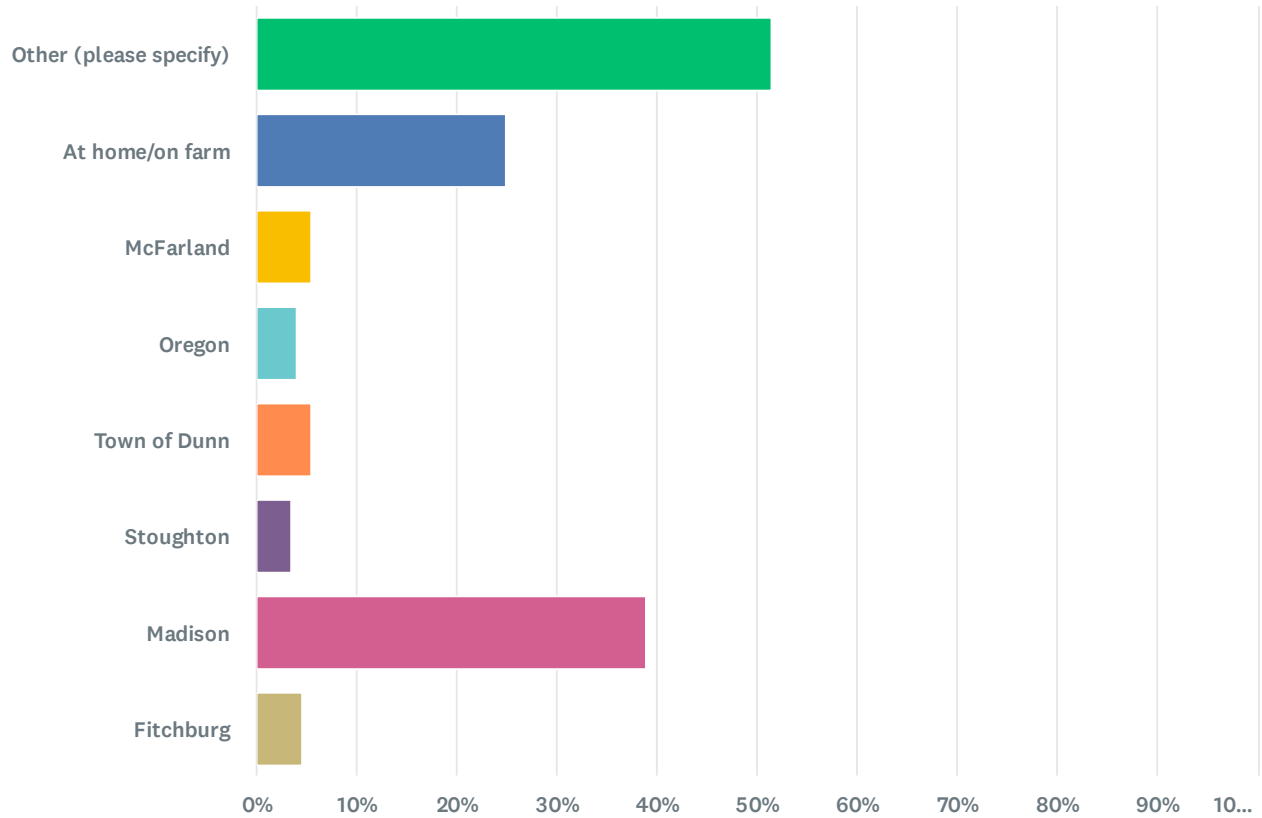

## Q21 Do you live or own property on a lake or waterway in the Town?

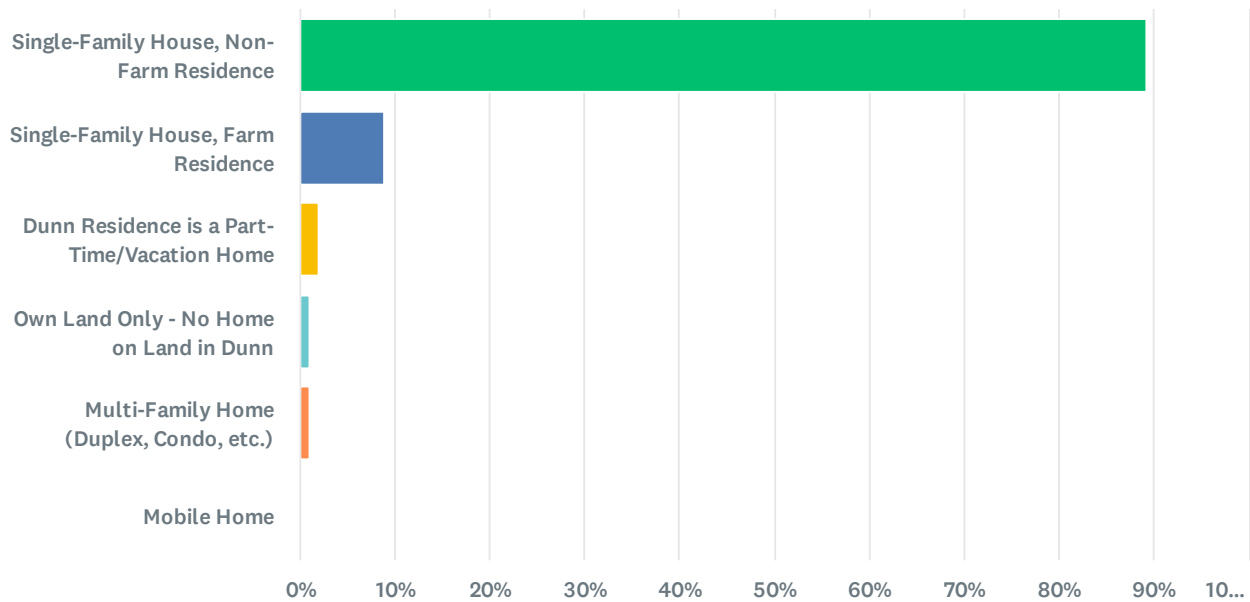
